Darko Gavrilović is professor of history at Faculty of Science in Novi Sad, Serbia. He is visiting professor at Faculty of European Legal and Political Studies in Novi Sad, Serbia. He is chief editor of the journal “Serb-Croat Relations in 20th century”, editor in journal „Polis Culture“, adviser of Euroclio organisation in Bosnia and Herzegovina and member of Association of Writers of Vojvodina. Professor Gavrilović’s research is focused on the Serb – Croat political relations in the 20th century, political myths and cultural studies. He has written a number of books, including “The Fields of the Serbian Medieval Culture”, “The Paths of the Serbian Culture”, “Stjepan Radić and Serbs 1871 – 1918”, “The Light and the Darkness of the Modern World, 1775-2000”, “The Strikes of Destiny – Political Myths in the 20. century”, In the Meanstrom of the Nationalism (Stjepan Radic and Serbs 1871 – 1918; Svetozar Pribicevic and Croats 1918 – 1936), “The Image of Jesus in the History of Culture” and “The Awakening of Europe”. Darko Gavrilović received Jewish Society Reward in Yugoslavia for the Novels in 1999 and in 2000. Also he received Diploma “St. Cirilo and Metodije” of Scientific Forum at Faculty of Philology in Lodz, Poland, for research in Slavic cultural relations in 2004.
