"Social and political conflict in the Republic of Cyprus (1960-2024)"

The lecture is organized within the context of the course "Politics and Government in Southern Europe. A Comparative Analysis" by Associate Professor E. Teperoglou and Professor I. Papageorgiou. The lecture will focus on the main political and social conflicts that have shaped the Republic of Cyprus since its independence in 1960 until today. Historical events such as intercommunal tensions, the evolution of the party system and contemporary political divisions will be analyzed. In addition, the role of political parties, social movements and European integration in shaping the Cypriot political landscape will be examined.

Giorgos Charalambous is Associate Professor of Political Science at the University of Nicosia. His research lies in comparative European politics and political sociology, focusing on party politics, political ideas and ideologies, mobilisation and contention, political behaviour broadly conceived, and the domestic politics of European integration. He is the author of two monographs, three edited collections, several journal articles, book chapters, essays, and opinion pieces. He holds an Msc in European Public Policy from University College London, a PhD in Politics from the University of Manchester, and a BA in Economic Studies and Government from the same university.
